Robyn Blackadar, Strathcona County

Throughout her career, Robyn has sought to contribute to the creation of a fair and just society where all people are respected and thrive. She has had over 30 years of work experience in Alberta's social and health system in such areas of policy development and analysis, quality improvement, knowledge mobilization, and program evaluation. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from the University of Calgary, a Master of Business Administration, Senior/Executive Management Development certificate, and a Canadian Health Services Research Foundation/Center for Knowledge Transfer Training Award from the University of Alberta.

In 2023, Robyn retired after 11 years as the President & CEO of PolicyWise for Children & Families, a nonprofit, charitable organization that generated and mobilized evidence for well-being through a collaborative, cross-sector approach between government, academia, and the community. Prior to her role with PolicyWise, Robyn held various senior leadership and policy positions in public sector organizations including Alberta Heath Services, Capital Health and the Government of Alberta's Ministries of Health, Transportation, and the Women's Secretariat. Participating in numerous province-wide, as well as national committees and strategies, Robyn has had valuable opportunities to support system change. She was involved in initiatives such as A Stronger, Safer Tomorrow, Valuing Mental Health Strategy, Building an Inclusive Education System, Early Childhood Research and Innovation Strategy, and Integrated Youth Mental Health Hubs. An advocate for the appropriate and ethical use of data and research, Robyn was a reviewer for the Canadian Institute of Health Research, community data lead for Making the Shift Youth Homelessness Center of Excellence and Co-Chair of the Alberta Nonprofit Data Strategy. As a champion for a strong and impactful nonprofit/Voluntary sector, Robyn served on the Alberta Nonprofit Network, the Alberta Nonprofit/Voluntary Sector Initiative, and was a member of Imagine Canada's Equity Collective.

Robyn is currently a part-time assistant lecturer in the School of Business at the University of Alberta, instructing courses in nonprofit/public sector management and leadership. She is also an active volunteer in her community, serving on Strathcona County's Seniors Advisory Committee and Social Framework Grants Advisory Committee.
