

Is a Police Information Check Necessary?

Volunteers work with vulnerable persons may/may not require a Police Information Check or Vulnerable Sector Check. Use these examples as a tool to explore making a determination.

ELEMENTS OF THE POSITION

POSITION TITLE	After Four Program Volunteer
DUTIES/ACTIVITIES	Work one-to-one with young students as a tutor on various scholastic subjects. Identify goals and highlight areas of strength and improvement for the child. Prepare weekly lessons; meet with student to review work and progress; provide support and encouragement.
CLIENT/PEOPLE SERVED	Children ages 6 - 12.
LOCATION/SETTING	Activity room at local community centre or school.
SUPERVISION/TRAINING	On-going support from the tutoring program supervisor and child's teacher.
OTHER DETAILS	Must have strong English skills and knowledge of subject being tutored.
